You too be patient; strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. Do not complain, brethren, against one another, so that you yourselves may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing right at the door. (James 5:7-9)

Whether Christ returns in our lifetime, or we, as believers in Him, are taken to Him in death, He is near. And, when He comes, all things will be made right. All suffering will end for us. All wrongs will be corrected, all sickness healed.

We can trust Him in this and walk in this hope. "Hope" in the Biblical terms is not a wish, but the "confident assurance of sure coming events." I saw it in my friend's face today. She believes that God has more for her to do and in God's perfect timing she will shed her

earthly house and be ushered into a "house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens" (2 Corinthians 5:21).
